- Nominee's area(s) of contribution (must be for one or more of the four categories)
- Special achievements and impact
- Awards and other recognition previously received

Additional letters of support, newspaper articles, etc. that support the nomination may also be attached.

Dr. Alice Holloway Young

Dr. Alice Holloway Young was a pioneering educator who dedicated over 50 years to advancing young people through education. Dr. Young earned her Bachelor's degree from Bennett College and her Master's and Doctoral degrees from the University of Rochester. In 1952, she became one of the first African American classroom teachers in the Rochester City School District. She broke numerous barriers, becoming the district's first African American reading specialist, vice-principal, principal, Title 1 director, and central office administrator. Dr. Young also developed the district's first integration programs, including the enduring Urban Suburban Program. As a founding trustee of Monroe Community College in 1961, Dr. Young served as Chair of the board from 1978 to 1998, significantly impacting thousands of students. Her numerous accolades include the renaming of Nathaniel Rochester School Number 3 to Dr. Alice Holloway Young School Number 3 in 2021. Dr. Young passed away on April 17, 2024, at the age of 100, leaving a lasting legacy as a role model and trailblazer.
